

## **Postdoctoral Opportunity**

## Overview:

The Engendering Disability-Inclusive Development – Genre, handicap et développement inclusif (EDID-GHDI) partnership (<a href="www.edid-ghdi.ca">www.edid-ghdi.ca</a>), together with the College of Social and Applied Human Sciences, Department of Political Science, and the Guelph Institute for Development Studies, is offering a one-year postdoctoral opportunity at the University of Guelph in 2025. The postdoctoral scholar will also teach one course in Political Science and one course in International Development Studies as part of their appointment.

Using collaborative, engaging and interactive approaches, the EDID-GHDI partnership (funded by SSHRC 2020-27) brings together researchers, decision-makers and civil society organizations in Haiti, Vietnam, South Africa and Canada, and transnationally, to:

- Uncover, create, and share knowledge about women and girls' struggles for and progress toward disabilityinclusive development, and explore how women and girls with disabilities contribute to discussions of rights and
  justice.
- Engender disability-inclusive development policies that remove barriers and enable inclusion and participation.

This postdoctoral appointment will contribute to the partnership through research related to one of the following areas or another related area proposed by the applicant:

- Transnational mobilizations around gendered disability rights;
- Comparative challenges for intersectional human rights organizations related to gendered disability rights (e.g. leadership, capacity, connections with international treaty body structures, etc.);
- Comparative and/or transnational research on specific themes related to gendered disability rights (e.g. gender-based violence, transitional justice, donor development cooperation policies, sexual and reproductive health and rights, etc.)

Start Date: Early January 2025 preferably, although a later start date could be considered
